This side event will focus on the crucial role civil society organizations (CSOs) must play in the implementation of SDG 17, and with that, all SDGs. It will show there are serious gaps between what has been agreed internationally and what happens in practice.

During this side event, an independent study (report to be published on [taskteamcso.com](http://taskteamcso.com) on 1 July 2020) by the [International Institute of Social Studies](http://International Institute of Social Studies) will be presented which includes the finding that large parts of civil society, especially those that are not part of the typical aid communities in the capitals, are not sufficiently engaged in the SDGs and consultations at the country level.

This side event will be hosted by the **Government of Ireland, as Co-chair of the Task Team**, with contributions from Kenya (TBC), Canada, the CSO Partnership for Development Effectiveness (CPDE), and the OECD. It is envisioned that the opening address will be given by a senior level representative from the Government of Ireland, followed by a keynote address from **Mr. Clément Voule, UN Special Rapporteur on the Rights to Freedom of Peaceful Assembly and of Association**.
